The successful Respondent shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable national and local laws and regulations.

5 Employment Equity Act

Respondents must comply with the requirements of the Employment Equity Act 55 of 1998 applicable to it including (but not limited to) Section 53 of the Employment Equity Act.

6 Changes to Quotations

Changes by the Respondent to its submission will not be considered after the closing date and time.

7 Binding Offer

Any Quotation furnished pursuant to this Request shall be deemed to be an offer. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.

8 Disclaimers

- 8.1 Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFQ and/or its receipt of a Quotation in response to it. Please note that Transnet reserves the right to:
 - modify the RFQ's goods / service(s) and request Respondents to re-bid on any changes;
 - reject any Quotation which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein;

- disqualify Quotations submitted after the stated submission deadline;
- not necessarily accept the lowest priced Quotation or an alternative bid;
- place an order in connection with this Quotation at any time after the RFO's closing date;
- award only a portion of the proposed goods / services which are reflected in the scope of this RFQ;
- split the award of the order/s between more than one Supplier/Service Provider should it at Transnet's discretion be more advantageous in terms of, amongst others, cost or developmental considerations;
- cancel the quotation process;

9 Specification/Scope of Work

Spectacle Frames (including ready readers and sunglasses)

The Eye Clinic must have a variety of frames for the patients to be able to choose their preference. This includes children and adults and according to the gender that patients identify with.

The following specifications are mandatory:

Frame Materials:

Frames must be Cellulose Propionate (Transparent, high gloss, tough and rigid material that is ecofriendly and ideally suited to high quality spectacle frames. The combination of the properties listed below are essential to ensure that the material does not break or deform with temperature variations, and allows for adjustment when being fitted and dispensed to patients.

Properties:

- The cellulose must be synthesized by esterification with propionic anhydride under acid c catalysis
- Melting Temperature not below 234 Celsius

- Material Density must fall between 1.18 1.23 g/cm3
- Tensile strength 15 39Mpa
- Bending Modus 830 1690 MPA
- Film Tear strength 4kg/mm
- Folding Resistance 80 times
- Resistant to sweat erosion

The colours and pattern finish of the frames should be as follows:

- Front: Black Gloss Temples: Black Gloss
- Front: Smokey Grey Temples: Smokey Grey
- Front: Transparent Maroon / Pink Gradient Temples: Transparent Maroon with floral inlay
- Front: Black Gloss Outside, Pink Inside Temples: Black Gloss outside / Pink Inside
- Front: Black Gloss Outside / Purple Inside Temples: Black Gloss Outside / animal print pattern on the inside
- Front: Royal Blue Gloss Temples: Black Outside / Royal blue inside
- Front: Brown Tortoise Shell Temples: Brown Tortoise Shell

The sizes of the frames must be as follows:

- Men Large 56 18 145
- Men Medium 54-18-145
- Ladies Large 54-17-140
- Ladies Medium 52-17-140
- Ladies Small 50-16-140
- Unisex Medium 53-18-145
- Unisex Small 51-20-140

A variety of frame styles are required as follows:

- Round
- Square
- Cats Eye
- Rectangular
- Oval

Screws to secure the temples to the frame should be high quality steel screws and rust resistant.

- Temples should be ergonomically designed with curves for comfort, reinforced with copper to provide strength and support adjustment during dispensing.
- Hinges should be high quality spring hinges to provide a wider angle of flex, thereby reducing the chance of accidental snapping of the frame and to accommodate wider head sizes

 All frames to be bespoke with the following printed on the inside of the temples: 'PHELOPHEPHA'

Spectacle Lenses

The Phelophepa Eye Clinics have their own laboratories on board the trains where spectacles are made (cutting and fitting). Patients' prescriptions are cut from the lenses and fitted to frames chosen by the patients. Lenses must be made to the following specifications:

- CR39
- Finished Single Vision 1.50
- Index: 1.50
- Material : Allyl Di-glycol Carbonate (ADC)
- Abbe Value: 58
- Diameter: 65mm
- Minus Lens Center Thickness tolerance is +- 0.15
- Plus Lens Edge Thickness tolerance is +- 0.15

Spectacle Cases & Cloths

Spectacle cases should be of a good quality and stackable for efficient storage

Spectacle cloths should be microfiber with the following specifications:

- 70/30 split of Polyester and Polyamide and must be branded "PHELOPHEPA" on the cloth
- Size 150mm x 100mm
- Weight 190 g/sqm
- Colour White
- All cases should be branded "PHELOPHEPA" on the outside

TERMS OF REFERENCE

- The supplier must delivery timeously and reliably.
- The supplier must ensure the correct items are delivered per order and be sure of the contents in boxes delivered.
- A proposal needs to be accompanied by a clear breakdown of costs and activities to outline the budget comprehensively. Suppliers are advised that Transnet will undertake background checks on the profile of the supplier / company.
- Submission of written references from contactable referees. References must contain: nature of work provided by the supplier, duration of work, what products were supplied, statement of satisfaction from referee.

- The supplier must provide ISO9001 certification for the factories that are manufacturing the frames and lenses and must also provide a 'CE rating' from the manufacturers of the lenses and frames. (ISO9001 Certificate and CE rating)
- Suppliers must have a medical device establishment license with The South African health Products Regulatory Authority. (SAHPRA Certificate)

10 Legal review

A Proposal submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business.

11 Security clearance

Acceptance of this bid could be subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent, its personnel providing the goods and its subcontractor(s) must obtain security clearance from the appropriate authorities to the level of CONFIDENTIAL/ SECRET/TOP SECRET. Obtaining the required clearance is the responsibility of the Successful Respondent. Acceptance of the bid is also subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent will implement all such security measures as the safe performance of the contract may require.

12 National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

Respondents are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Transnet is required to ensure that price quotations are invited and accepted from prospective bidders listed on the CSD. Business may not be awarded to a respondent who has failed to register on the CSD. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD. The CSD can be accessed at https://secure.csd.gov.za/.

For this purpose, the attached SBD 1 Form must be completed and submitted as a mandatory returnable document by the closing date and time of the bid.

13 Tax Compliance

Respondents must be compliant when submitting a proposal to Transnet and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this bid that the tax matters of the successful Respondents be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Respondents tax obligations.

The Tax Compliance status requirements are also applicable to foreign Respondents/ individuals who wish to submit bids.

Where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved, each party must be registered on the Central Supplier Database and their tax compliance status will be verified through the Central Supplier Database.

14 Protection of Personal Data

In responding to this bid, Transnet acknowledges that it may obtain and have access to personal data of the Respondents. Transnet agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by Respondents in their response to this bid for the purpose of evaluating and subsequent award of business and in accordance with any



Furthermore, Transnet will not otherwise modify, amend or alter any personal data submitted by Respondents or disclose or permit the disclosure of any personal data to any Third Party without the prior written consent from the Respondents. 1.4 STEP FOUR: Post Tender Negotiations (if applicable)

• Respondents are to note that Transnet may not award a contract if the price offered is not market-related. In this regard, Transnet reserves the right to engage in PTN with the view to achieving a market-related price or to cancel the tender. Negotiations will be done in a sequential manner i.e.:

- first negotiate with the highest ranked bidder or cancel the bid, should such negotiations fail,
- o negotiate with the 2nd and 3rd ranked bidders (if required) in a sequential manner.
- In the event of any Respondent being notified of such short-listed/preferred bidder status, his/her bid, as well as any subsequent negotiated best and final offers (BAFO), will automatically be deemed to remain valid during the negotiation period and until the ultimate award of business.
- Should Transnet conduct post tender negotiations, Respondents will be requested to provide their best and final offers to Transnet based on such negotiations. Where a market related price has been achieved through negotiation, the contract will be awarded to the successful Respondent(s).

1.5 STEP FIVE: Award of business and conclusion of contract

- Immediately after approval to award the contract has been received, the successful or preferred bidder(s) will be informed of the acceptance of his/their Quotation by way of a Letter of Award. Thereafter the final contract will be concluded with the successful Respondent(s).
- Otherwise, a final contract will be concluded and entered into with the successful Bidder at the acceptance of a letter of award by the Respondent.

2 Validity Period

Transnet requires a validity period of 90 [ninety] Business Days from the closing date of this RFQ, excluding the first day and including the last day.

Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bid, on the same terms and conditions, if the internal evaluation process has not been finalised within the validity period. However, once the adjudication body has approved the process and award of the business to the successful bidder(s), the validity of the successful bidder(s)' bid will be deemed to remain valid until a final contract has been concluded.

3 Disclosure of Prices Quoted

Respondents are to note that, on award of business, Transnet is required to publish the tendered prices and preferences claimed of the successful and unsuccessful Respondents *inter alia* on the National Treasury e-Tender Publication Portal, (www.etenders.gov.za), as required per National Treasury Instruction Note 01 of 2015/2016.
